Aruba: Her Heart Is Healed

Aruba's heart surgery was a complete success! Our sweet little Aruba, AKA Houdini Hound, had her heart fixed at the University of Minnesota Veterinary Medical Center on August 16th.

Patent Ductus Arteriosus is a birth defect where the ductus does not close off and between the heart and the aorta. Because the ductus did not close off 20% of the blood Aruba was pumping into her aorta was going right back into her heart. Her heart was 25% larger than it should have been from having to work so much harder.

Fortunately, Aruba's heart was very strong on her initial ECHO and was in no immediate danger. Our GPA vets recommend she have the procedure done at the University because of the complex nature of open-heart surgery. The University is pioneering a much less invasive surgery that does not require open heart surgery.

The University performs the surgery by making an incision on her inner thigh and inserting a catheter into her leg. This catheter contains two metal discs that were specifically designed to fit the wholes on each side of Aruba's ductus. The catheter and metal discs then made their way up into Aruba's ductus and were put into place. Once this was done the catheter was removed. A little glue closed the incision, and the surgery was finished. It was a complete success! She could have gone home that night, but they want to keep all the patients for a follow up ECHO to make sure neither disc had moved. Thankfully, neither did.

Dr Stuathammer opened the door to get Aruba; she was lying on her back with six vet techs rubbing her belly and her tail thumping off the ground. I do not think she even noticed I was on the other side of the door until the last person stopped rubbing her belly. Did she come running over when the last person stopped rubbing her belly? No, she just thumped her tail harder so I would come and pet her. Anyone who knows Aruba would expect nothing less. On our way out of the hospital, five or six others stopped to say good bye to Aruba. I felt like the invisible man.

Her prognosis is a happy, healthy and long life. She went home on antibiotics and two weeks of short walks, no running or fence jumping! That lasted less than a week. Short walks-no problem, antibiotics-no problem, no running-no problem, however, no fence

Eye Care for Our Hounds

Greyhound eyes are wonderful things to see – they really are windows into the dog’s soul. But sometimes we see things that we don’t expect to see there; at the slightest sign of an eye problem, take your hound to the vet. Do not wait to see if it gets worse because it usually will. On a regular basis, take notice of your greyhound’s eyes – check for redness, itchiness, squinting, or mucus discharge. It is even recommended that you check the pupils to see if they move in reaction to light or if they differ in movement to the other eye.

Three types of discharge:

1. Thick mucus discharge usually indicates a problem that should be looked at by a vet.
2. Clear watery discharge could be a symptom of allergies, a small object lodged in the eye, or a tear drainage problem.
3. If you see a LOT of water drainage over the eye and into the face then it could be a result of a clogged tear drainage duct.

Pannus is an eye condition that involves the clear outer cornea of the eye. It is usually first discovered as a sort of cloudiness of the cornea, possibly with tears. Over a period of a few weeks, this will progress until a thin web of blood vessels spreads inward toward the center of the cornea. If you let Pannus progress beyond this point, then your greyhound’s vision could be seriously impaired. Both eyes are affected, though the diseased regions may be asymmetric. The cause of Pannus is not very well understood and it can be treated if caught in time. Ultraviolet light affects pannus, so the condition will likely worsen in the summertime when the sunshine is strongest – this is especially relevant in higher altitudes.

The treatment for Pannus is steroid ointment in the eye to get rid of the blood vessels. Before putting the ointment in the eye, be sure the vet checks for active ulcers in the eyes. *This is very important!* If there is an active ulcer, it must be treated before the steroid treatment for Pannus is initiated. If this is not done, it could lead to blindness. Unfortunately there is no cure for Pannus – we can just try to control it.


